Scramble Rules for the Tournament

- 1. All players will tee off.
- 2. Each team then decides which members' ball is the best shot, then all other players retrieve their balls and play from the best ball position. Preferred lies will be allowed but within one club length of the best ball position.
- 3. Play continues this way until the ball is holed.
- 4. Additional rules:
 - Tees will be off the blue markers, women will be off the red markers.
 - Men 70 years of age are allowed to move to the green tees unless you can drive the ball 200 yards.
 - Each team member must use their tee shot as the selected best ball at least two times (please indicate that on the scorecard).
 - The team must pick up the ball and move to the next hold if they reach double par.
- 5. Mulligans will be sold for \$5 each with a maximum of two per player. Therefore, they cannot be used more than twice by any team member. Please indicate the use of mulligans on the scorecard by each player.
